LOCATION: Bondi to Tamarama Coastal Walk

This public walk traverses the coastline between Bondi and Tamarama Beaches, and intersects the cliff-top clearing of Mark's Park at its approximate halfway juncture. Pathways along the walk encompass several steep staircases with occasional seating. Beachside parklands offer play areas, cafes and toilet facilities.

Sculpture by the Sea, Bondi 2019

- From 24 October to 10 November over one hundred sculptures will be exhibited along the Bondi to Tamarama Coastal Walk. In addition to the artworks, a reception office, several site offices, catalogue marquees, sponsor displays, kiosks, workshop marquees and a temporary indoor gallery will be installed along the walk and in Marks Park for the exhibition and attended by *Sculpture by the Sea* Site Crew, Staff and Volunteers.

Drop off and collection point for hired buses/coaches

The drop off and collection point for hired buses/ coaches is on Campbell Parade - South of Bondi Beach near Sandridge Street at the bottom of Bondi Road. This is the ONLY designated area provided for hired buses/coaches. Please do not stop at any of the public bus stops in the area. Fines apply. Once children have been dropped off buses need to find parking.

Walking to the exhibition from the Campbell Parade drop off/collection designated area

- To start the exhibition at Notts Avenue, turn right towards Bondi Beach and right into Hunter Park (approx. 3 mins walk).
- To entre the exhibition at Marks Park turn left and walk along Sandridge Street and left into Fletcher Street (approx. 5mins walk).

There is NO access for hired buses/coaches to Tamarama.

- Walking to Tamarama along the coastal path is approximately 1.3 km. A shorter route (bypassing the exhibition and coastal path) to Tamarama can be via back streets continuing along Sandridge Street where there are four minor roads to cross (12 mins walk).

Due to the outdoor nature of the exhibition and potential exposure to all kinds of weather conditions, students and teachers are advised to wear enclosed shoes with flat soles, wear protective sun hats, long sleeves, eyewear and sunscreen, and carry water in non-breakable containers. In the event of wet weather, visitors are advised to bring raincoats, umbrellas and appropriate footwear. In the event of 80k winds, visitors will be evacuated from all marquee structures in the exhibition. Students should be advised in advance of the diverse nature of the sculptures and behave accordingly. Sculptures can NOT be climbed on. Care should be taken when interacting with artworks and students must be supervised at all times. Sculptures that cannot be touched will be sign-posted accordingly. 		Students should be advised of the locations of the <i>Sculpture by the Sea</i> Site Office and Catalogue Marquees along the coastal walk. Teachers in need of assistance should contact <i>Sculpture by</i> <i>the Sea</i> Staff, identified by blue 'staff' t-shirts with logo, located on site. Schools are expected to bring an appropriate First Aid kit from their school to meet the particular needs of their students and participants. 				 Teachers should have prior knowledge of the exhibition site and coastal walk. Teachers must schedule regular stops to check on group cohesion and maintain communication with other teacher/group leader at the tail end. Teachers must carry mobile phones or two-way radios for communication in the case of emergency. Students will be briefed as to the appropriate behaviour expected in a public place. Teachers will brief students as to the procedure when requiring the use of public toilets.

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Access	Best locations for obtaining wheelchair access to the exhibition is on the corner of Fletcher Street and Mark's Lane next to Mark's Park or down the (steep) driveway ramp to the disabled drop off car spot at Tamarama Beach on Pacific Avenue. These two locations enable reasonable access to significant sections of the exhibition without having to negotiate stairs. Once drop-off has been made vehicles must then move and find parking on the street, where normal parking restrictions will continue to apply. Please note that some of the grassed areas of the exhibition do not have pathways, and persons using wheelchairs should take this into account when planning their visits.
