

WRITE A HAIKU

Haiku (say 'HIGH coo') are short Japanese poems, often about nature and the beautiful world around us.

A haiku poem has three lines.

A syllable is a word that is said in one unit, for example, the word 'haiku' has two syllables as we say 'hai' - 'ku'.

The artists are inspired by the history and beauty of the Bondi coast. Many of them think very carefully about the place where their sculpture will be in the exhibition and how it will look with the sky and sea.

- The first line of a haiku has words that add up to 5 syllables.
- The second line has words that add up to 7 syllables.
- The third line has words that add up to 5 syllables.

Choose a sculpture that you like and think about how it looks against the clouds, sun, sea, sky, grass or sand.

Write a haiku poem about your thoughts.
